Recent Important Changes to Your Golf and Golf Course

Over the last few weeks you would have noticed a few changes to the White Course. We have made these changes to bring our average Monday scoring more in line with what most other clubs and courses experience and what most golfers playing KCC would expect - including those playing on a Thursday and Saturday. And we are sure you'll agree the last couple of Mondays have proved very successful.

Something else that's changing is the 105 Rule. Until further notice, if your age and handicap added together totals 105 or more, you are now eligible to tee off from the yellow tees on hole numbers 13 and 17.

More Care Required

When removing a flagstick on a green please ensure you do this with care to minimise damage to the cup edge. And please refrain from using the stick to remove your ball after a successful putt. With the flag-in or flag-out rule we now have when putting the stick is being handled much more often. There are a few clubs using a new style of flagstick but we do not have these - so care at all times is essential.
