


#### Nearest to the pin

Please note that until further notice there are 30cm (12") Preferred Lies Through the Green every Monday in the Men Veteran's Golf Competition. The ball may be placed, rather than dropped, when taking a preferred lie but no closer to the hole. This rather generous arrangement has been introduced as a result of the lack of rain we've had and how difficult it is to differentiate the fairways. There are currently a lot of bare patches on the course as well. A preferred lie will also help any veteran who is suddenly confronted with an old root and does not know how to cope. In fact, it's so dry out there that yesterday there was even a young root spotted on the 5<sup>th</sup> fairway that raised a few questions for a couple of the really old guys. Don't risk damaging your equipment on a root, regardless of age. Simply place your ball within 30cm at the closest point of relief and soldier on.
